Message from CEO

Lane continues to move forward and invest in the region. The four-story patient tower is progressing nicely and is opening at the end of the year. The majority of the exterior stonework and windows are in place. Drywall and insulation are going up on the third and fourth floors while framing, electrical, plumbing, lighting, and HVAC duct work are beginning on

the lower floors. We are completing the underground utilities, including electricity, water, gas, sewer, and a dedicated fire water line.

Inside the hospital, the front entrance and hallway to Imaging / Lab are temporarily closed due to renovations on the new patient registration and surgery pre-admit areas. These areas and the front entrance will reopen this fall.

Behind the scenes, we invested resources to complete an 18-month implementation project to launch Epic, our more robust electronic health record system, and MyChart, our new patient portal. We also launched new accounting software and materials management systems, and we enhanced our workforce wellness / occupational medicine program with a new audiogram sound booth at FastLane.

Our mission to provide exceptional health care service to every patient, every time is unwavering. As we forge ahead with our vision to be the best community healthcare system in the nation, we thank you for you continued support and trust.

"I'm excited to continue the excellent EVS program that we have at Lane," says Mike. "We have a great team who take pride in their work."



4-Story **Patient Tower** Work **Continues**

The front entrance of the hospital is temporarily closed for construction while the exterior canopy and interior lobby, new patient registration, and new surgery pre-admit areas are renovated.

Patients and visitors may enter through the Emergency Room.

Exterior brick has been installed and leak tested, and crews are now installing cap stones. The majority of windows have been installed with the exception of the ground floor. Preparations to install underground utilities are underway.

> The new patient tower is scheduled to open in December 2024.

- Wall framing
- Drywall

- Electrical tie-in of new A/C chillers
- Underground tie-ins for water, gas, electrical, sewer, fire water, and roof drains
- Installation of exterior cap stone
- Front entrance renovations

Once the entire expansion project is complete in 2026, major changes to the hospital will include:

- 4-story patient tower and 37,000 square feet of interior renovations
- 48 new patient rooms with large windows and walk-in showers
- 6 additional ICU rooms
- Entire 2nd floor dedicated to a contemporary surgery department
- 4 operating suites equipped with advanced technology
- 15 private pre- & post-surgery patient rooms
- Patient registration and pre-admit areas relocated to front entrance
- New dining room and serving line
- Expanded lab and imaging areas
- UV light technology for purified air throughout the facility
- Modernized front entrance

Occupational Therapy Edith Mims Patient Story

When Edith Mims experienced two strokes over a year ago, she recognized the symptoms when she fell at her sister's birthday gala. "I had fallen, and I tried to get up and fell again," remembers Edith. However, with the gala's festivities, she opted to remain at the party. "The next day, I had another stroke. We were having dinner, and I dropped the same fork three times; after that, I said it was time to go to the emergency room."

Edith's road to recovery has been long, but the progress she's made with her Occupational Therapists and the staff at Lane Outpatient Therapy has been incredible. After her stroke, she couldn't walk or use her right arm. She had to relearn how to feed herself, bathe and dress herself, and physically take care of the daily parts of her life. "At the beginning, they did everything they could to make me happy, and I needed that because I couldn't do anything for myself. I was encouraged and told what I needed to do and how I needed to do it." Edith recalls.

Today, Edith can participate in the things that she loves, such as church, the Council on Aging, and Southern's Jaguar football games. Edith has progressed from needing a wheelchair to using a cane. Now, she is ready to put that cane down.

Describing herself as a "Young 76" Edith has big plans as she continues to progress and improve with the help of Lane Outpatient Therapy. "More trips, more games, and more parties. I want to stay independent. I'm so grateful and thankful for the Occupational Therapists at Lane."



Edith does wish she'd have done things differently.

"When I had the first stroke, I should have gone to the hospital right then and there. The ER was great. When I moved to the Rehab Center, it got better. At Lane Outpatient Therapy, it was the best!"

Lane Endoscopy Center and Colon Cancer Awareness Dr. Joshua Best's Patient Story

Dr. Josh Best, an OB/GYN physician at Lane, recently turned 45 - the age where a colonoscopy was recommended for his own health. "The idea of having a colonoscopy is not very appealing. The bowel prep is the toughest part, but it's not terrible," remarks Dr. Best. "Now having gone through that myself, I can provide insight to my patients. The procedure itself is quick and painless, more like a power nap, as you're sedated the entire time."

Dr. Best includes colon cancer screenings as part of his regular regimen of female healthcare routines and evaluations. "I've been recommending colon cancer screenings to my patients for as long as I've been practicing medicine," says Dr. Best. "Typically, patients see me for a wellness or annual exam and are expecting a pap smear, a mammogram, etc. But once they turn 45, I like to cover why they need to schedule a colonoscopy."

A colonoscopy is a medical procedure used to examine the inside of the colon and rectum for abnormalities or signs of disease, such as colorectal cancer, polyps, inflammation, or bleeding. Colonoscopies are crucial for early detection and prevention of colorectal cancer, as they can detect precancerous growths, which can also be removed during the procedure before they develop into cancer.



Dr. Best's advice:

"I truly believe it's easier to have one unpleasant night of prep than to have colon cancer. Please talk to your doctor about getting a colonoscopy when you turn 45. I recommend the staff at Lane Gastroenterology and Lane Endoscopy Center; they are the best."



Lactation Consultation for New & Expecting Moms

If you are an expecting or breastfeeding mom, an appointment with a certified lactation consultant will help both you and your baby. Services include setting a breastfeeding routine, finding the best breastfeeding positions for you and baby, help with latching, milk supply, and other challenges, and recognizing breastfeeding conditions like mastitis and plugged ducts.
